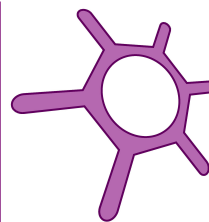

- 1 [Van Gogh Museum](#), Paulus Potterstraat 7 - the Van Gogh Museum houses the largest collection of Van Gogh's paintings and drawings in the world.

Other Points of Interest

- 4 [Rijksmuseum](#) - the Rijksmuseum possesses the largest and most important collection of classical Dutch art, e.g. works from Vermeer, Hals, Rembrandt (The Nightwatch). Additionally, the collection consists of a large variety of decorative art, e.g. Delftware 17th or century dollhouses. Currently, only the most important works are on display, since the Rijksmuseum is undergoing reconstruction works.
- 5 [Flower Market](#) - permanent market selling flowers, plants and tulip bulbs.
- 6 [Rembrandtplein](#),
- 7 [Leidseplein](#) - two large squares with many pubs and outdoor cafes.
- 8 [Begijnhof](#) - the Begijnhof is one of the oldest inner courts in the city which was used by Beguines, a lay sisterhood. Entrance from the Gedempte Begijnensloot.
- 9 [Anne Frank House](#) - The Anne Frank House is a museum dedicated to Jewish wartime diarist Anne Frank, who hid from Nazi persecution in hidden rooms at the rear of the building.
